We therefore welcome Dr. Ramsey Lewis and Dr. Andreas Zemann onto the board.

Dr. Ramsey Lewis is a Professor of Crop Science at North Carolina State University. His research activities cover genetics and breeding to develop and study improved and novel plant breeding methodologies with a special focus on the tobacco plant. Dr. Lewis's work in applied genetics research relative to tobacco is nationally and internationally recognized. Professor Lowell Bush has been an important member of the Advisory Board for 16 years, having joined the board in 1999.
