

## **Editorial Policy**

Social Change Review (SCR) is an international peer-reviewed journal edited by the Sociology and Social Work Unit of the Lucian Blaga University of Sibiu in partnership with Newman University, Birmingham. It aims to provide a forum for research and scientific debates on a wide range of topics related to social change and transformation within contemporary societies, with a special focus on Euro-Asian area. The journal explores social, cultural, and political change from various perspectives within the larger field of social sciences. Both empirical-based (quantitative or qualitative approaches) and theoretical contributions are welcome.

The journal is biannual, having both online and printed versions. Usually, there is one regular issue of the journal and one special issue. Regular issues are open to a large variety of topics related to social change and may include: research articles, research essays, research notes, and book reviews.

Special issues have a guest editor and are aimed at publishing interrelated contributions under a common heading. They normally are open to the same types of contributions. However the guest editor is free to decide her/his preference for a specific type of contribution (only research articles, for example). The topics of the special issues are announced in advance both on the SCR website and within the final pages of previous printed issues.

All submitted articles are subject to double-blind peer reviewing.
