Evolution of Cultural Landscapes. *Longue duree* of local wine landscapes.

Presented special issue will be focused on the evolution of cultural landscapes understood according to the definition contained in *European Landscape Convention of the Council of Europe* (2000) as well as in line with findings of *World Heritage Committee*.

World Heritage Committee define a cultural landscape as the cultural properties [that] represent the combined works of nature and of man:

1. "a landscape designed and created intentionally by man"
2. an "organically evolved landscape" which may be a "relict (or fossil) landscape" or a "continuing landscape"
3. an "associative cultural landscape" which may be valued because of the "religious, artistic or cultural associations of the natural element."(UNESCO, 2012)

The special issue will be focused especially **on the regional differences of the evolution of wine landscapes in places where vineyards are a crucial element of the local landscape and production of wine is very important occupation**. The editors are very interested in wine landscapes which 'were established' hundreds years ago and they are still alive changing its shape. The editors would like that the articles would give the perspective of F. Braudel („longue durée”) if it's possible.

The article should have c. 15 pages including bibliography and maps and should be send till 15th December 2017.
