

International Computer Archive of Modern and Medieval English (ICAME)

ICAME is an international organization of linguists and information scientists working with English machine-readable texts. The aim of the organization is to collect and distribute information on English language material that is available for computer processing, and on linguistic research completed or in progress on this material, to compile an archive of English text corpora in machine-readable form, and to make material available to research institutions.

Uni Computing in Bergen, Norway, acts as a distribution centre for computerized English-language corpora and corpus-related software (for details, see p. 179 in this issue). Annual conferences have been arranged since 1979. The present issue of the *ICAME Journal* (previously *ICAME News*) is published by De Gruyter Open (DGO).

ICAME Corpus Collection

The collection was made in the period of 1977–1999. The total number of words for all 20 corpora amounts to 17 million (7.9 million words of written modern text, 2.5 million of transcribed speech and 6.6 million of historical text). 5.5 million words have been tagged for part of speech. The modern texts are from the 1960's onwards.

This collection is now being made available through the CLARIN infrastructure (icame.uib.no/clarin/) with the Corpuscle system (clarino.uib.no/corpuscle). Corpuscle is a web-based corpus management and analysis platform developed at Uni Research, Bergen. Academic users are able to search, analyse and download various ICAME corpora in Corpuscle: please see the instructions at <http://clu.uni.no/icame/clarin/login.html> for how to access the resources.
