Editorial Policy

Lithuanian Foreign Policy Review aims to publish research articles on Central Eastern European region, especially focusing on matters of regional cooperation and security.

The articles should formulate a clear definition of a problem, review the extent to which the problem has been researched and how innovative and relevant it is. Well founded arguments, analysis, results of the research and conclusions should be presented.

All material must be original, must not have appeared elsewhere, and must not be submitted for publication elsewhere.

Lithuanian Foreign Policy Review uses peer review for most its editorial decisions and the editors read all received articles. If article is in accordance with our thematic scope and is acceptable in terms of academic standards it is checked for plagiarism. All selected articles go through language editing.

The approximate length required for the articles is 6 000 - 9 000 words (including footnotes but excluding an abstract). On all matters concerning the publication of submitted manuscripts the editor's decision is final.

We also accept opinion articles which might express quick reactions to the previous published articles, reflections on the current processes in the region, or are a book review. The opinion pieces should not exceed 4000 words.
